<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Meet with your mentee once a week with a minimum of twice a month for a total of at least 15 times a school year!● Be a positive and professional role model for your student!● Use provided TSIC materials with your mentees.● Per protocol: Mentoring Sessions in Franklin County can be virtual, through the TSIC app, or at school.● Use the TSIC App for texting students and logging sessions.● Keep in touch with the College Success Coach and the Student Services Coordinator.	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Complete a TSIC Mentor Application: https://schools.scriptapp.com/#!/workflow-submission/978982992b3c27e48ed06455897ffc95ed533ff004. Once accepted, sign the Mentor Agreement which will be sent to you by email.5. Complete the TSIC Mentor Training: The link will be sent to you by email6. Download the TSIC App to communicate with your mentee.7. Begin mentoring sessions with your mentee!
